

Keep Your Home Secure While Vacationing

4. Unplug

5. Put the Spare Key Away

8. Use Your Webcam as a Surveillance Camera

Surveillance systems do not come cheap. You can set up a fairly effective option yourself. There are many free software options available on the internet. Many allow you to View and record live videos. Some allow motion detection and send you alerts. Do some research and set yours up!

9. Tell your Alarm Company

If you have a home protection service in place, tell them you are leaving!

10. Hold Your Mail

An overstuffed mailbox, or packages left sitting on your step for days on end is an obvious sign that you are not at home. Stop by or go online to the United States Postal Service and ask them to stop delivery until you get back. Don't forget to do the same for your newspaper too!
